Coach Defined

A coach is one who provides any type of instruction specific to a sport or activity. All coaches, paid or not paid, must be submitted online. Such person shall, therefore, meet the standards for coaching in the interscholastic program as provided in By-Laws 3.1 through 3.1.10. A coach must be "approved" by the MSHSAA office prior to instructing students. An egregious or intentional violation of the MSHSAA by-laws or the rules/regulations of the sport may cause the Board of Directors to withhold "approved" status.

Online Rules Review Requirement

Each school shall be responsible for requiring all coaches (as defined in By-Laws 3.1 through 3.1.10) to complete a MSHSAA Rules Review, except for those coaching an emerging sport. When a coach does not complete the rules review, the school shall justify the deficiency in writing to the MSHSAA office. There will be a \$50 fine per coach to open the review once it has been closed.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

The following are questions and answers pertaining to the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws and/or MSHSAA Board of Directors policy. These are provided as an aid in interpreting the rules and regulations which MSHSAA member schools have adopted. If you have a specific area and/or question which you would like explained, contact Dr. Kerwin Urhahn, MSHSAA executive director. Your attention is called to the fact questions and answers regarding interpretations of the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws appear following the Constitution Article or By-Law they relate to in the MSHSAA Official Handbook.

Question: Our school district supports three high schools. Our Board of Education will permit and grant requests from students to attend a high school in which their parents' residence is not located in that high school's established geographic attendance area. The family does, however, reside in the school district. Would this scenario fall within the requirements of residence in MSHSAA By-Law 3.10.2?

Answer: No. The by-laws carefully define residence as being within the established geographic attendance area for the individual member school and not an entire school district of multiple schools at the same level. In the situation described, the students would have restricted eligibility in all sports if freshmen or restricted eligibility by sport if transferring high schools after the ninth grade.

Question: Our school encourages our students to use our weight room for out of season conditioning. Our athletic coaches take roll of their student athletes and expect them to participate in this program. If the students do not attend the coaches counsel with them that they should be there for the good of the team. Is this appropriate action by our coaches?

Answer: No. Participation in an out-of-season conditioning program is completely voluntary and must be open to any student who desires to attend. Taking roll for team attendance is signaling to the students a record of team member attendance is being kept even though the activity is voluntary. The follow-up with the students and so called "counseling" to attend has definitely tied participation with team responsibility outside of the season. The adults have implied to the students they are expected to attend and this is a responsibility to the team

Because there is a fine line that can be crossed, school administrators must educate their coaches of what is appropriate and must monitor carefully the out-of-season conditioning programs.

Question: Our football coaches have worked out a schedule for the summer and have divided up the duties to give them some time off at home with their families. The head coach is going to work with the team on Mondays and Wednesdays and play seven-on-seven on Saturdays. Our assistant coaches are going to open up the weight room on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We would also like to host our own full contact camp the fourth week in July for four days. a) Do we have to count all of these days as contact days? b) Can our assistant coaches go to the games on Saturdays? and c) when does the summer period end?

Answer: A) the days that the coach or any coach from that sport is giving instruction will be counted as a contact day therefore; the head coach would have to count his days as contact days. If the assistant coaches are following By-Law 3.15 for out-of-sport conditioning they will not be counted towards the contact days. However, if sport specific instruction takes place they will count as contact days. Example: Weight training is over and the kickers go and get a couple of balls and practice kicking out on the field ;contact has occurred for that sport. B) Your assistants can attend any function. The school must keep tract of sport specific contact. Any football contact, with instruction is considered one day of contact. You can have three coaches with three different sets of students from the same school doing different things on the same day and that is one day of contact. C) for fall sports the summer ends July 31. For all other sports the summer ends with the Sunday of week six of the standardized calendar.

Question: Who cannot coach a nonschool team during the school year outside a particular sport's school season?

Answer: No member of the coaching staff of any sport (not just the sport in question) from any school that any student on the nonschool team currently attends or will attend the following year can coach this particular nonschool team during the school outside the specific sport's school season (MSHSAA By-Law 3.14.2.e).

Question: Is there a difference to the rule mentioned in the question above if the nonschool competition occurs in the summer after school is dismissed for the summer:

Answer: Yes, during the summer months, the nonschool team participants in any sport may be coached by a member of the schools coaching staff of the school the nonschool participant has attended the previous school year or will attend the next school year (MSHSAA By-Law 3.15.3 Editor's Note).

Summer Questions & Answers

Summer School Questions

Summer school courses and credit earned may count toward academic eligibility if specific requirements are met. The individual school district must first adopt an official position that summer school credit shall be accepted. The policy on summer school credit should be placed in writing and readily provided for informational purposes to parents and students. It should be made clear that correspondence school courses and electives do not meet this requirement.

The following questions and answers should be helpful and shared with your school counselors.

Question: Will students be able to count summer school credit toward meeting the academic eligibility requirements for the first semester of the 2013-2014 school year?

Answer: Yes. By-Law 2.3 provides students may count up to 1 unit of credit from summer school toward establishing their eligibility for the fall semester. Only classes, which are required for graduation from the local school, may be counted toward meeting the academic requirement. Electives are not accepted.

Question: Should we have some type of a form that our counselors may want to use to advise the student and parents if the class(es) being taken in summer school will or will not count toward regaining academic eligibility?

Answer: Absolutely. The counseling department and the school athletic and activities directors must all work together to be certain students are advised properly before taking the class. If any questions arise the MSHSAA office should be contacted. (573-875-4880)

Question: If a student needs 1 unit of credit in physical education and has earned that credit by the end of the sophomore year, may the student take physical education during the summer after the junior year as an elective and count this credit toward re-establishing his academic eligibility?

Answer: No. Only classes required for graduation as set form by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and/ or the local school may be counted in summer school. Electives would not count toward regaining eligibility.

Question: May one of our students take summer school in another district and count the credit earned towards eligibility?

Answer: Yes, provided the class is required for graduation and your school is going to accept the credit and place on the student's transcript.

Question: If one of our student's fails Algebra I must that student take Algebra I in summer school or could the student take a required science class if Algebra I is not being offered?

Answer: A student is not required to take the same class failed during the school year. The student may retake the class during summer school, but it is not required. The only requirement for a summer school class to be counted towards academic eligibility is that the class is a graduation requirement for the school and cannot be an elective.

Question: Is it mandatory that our school accept summer school credit for determining academic eligibility for the fall semester?

Answer: No. This like all other requirements of student eligibility are the minimum essential requirements and each local Board of Education/Governing Body has the right to establish more stringent requirements.

Question: What is meant by the core classes required for graduation by DESE?

Answer: In order for all students across the state to meet a minimal curricular program it was adopted by the schools to rely upon core courses and required credits for graduation as required by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. Currently these minimum requirements are as follows: Practical Arts = 1 credit; Fine Arts = 1 credit; Physical Education = 1 credit; Science = 2 credits; Mathematics = 2 credits; Communication Arts = 3 credits; and Social Studies = 2 credits. In addition a student may also count other required classes.

Warning Labels on Football Helmet Required

Each player's football helmet, by rule, must have a visible exterior warning label regarding the risk of injury. The label is part of the National Operating Committee on Standards for Athletic Equipment (NOCSAE) standard and indicates that players have been instructed and understand the risks involved in the game of football. Football helmet manufacturers, helmet reconditioning, sporting goods dealers and individual salesmen, in most cases, will provide free exterior warning labels to the schools.

How Do Students and Parents Learn the Eligibility Requirements?

An incoming seventh grader or ninth grader enters your school with anticipation of activity participation. It is her first opportunity to be a part of an interscholastic program. The student and the parents are unaware of academic requirements, semesters of participation, age requirements, nonschool competition requirements, amateur and awards standards, etc. How are our young people and their parents to learn of the eligibility requirements necessary to earn and maintain student eligibility? How do they learn about the interscholastic program, its purpose and philosophy? This is essential.

It is the responsibility of the staff of each member school to properly advise and educate the students and their parents of the eligibility requirements. The youngsters in our programs are placed in a vulnerable position when the school administration and activities staff do not review and clarify the eligibility rules and the purpose and philosophy of our programs.

Member schools should make certain that students expecting to compete in their school's athletic and activity programs clearly understand the standards of eligibility. As an aid in properly informing students, the MSHSAA annually publishes a brochure entitled "How to Protect Your High School Eligibility." A copy of this brochure is sent to all member schools in the August packet each year and with the sport rule book mailings. Member schools may make copies or order a supply from the MSHSAA office at a minimal cost per copy to cover the costs of printing and postage. The information can also be found at www.mshsaa.org.

All students participating in athletics and activities should be given one of these brochures as standard procedure. In addition, coaches and directors should take time to review the pamphlet with members of their sports squads and activities groups to explain all eligibility requirements. Eligibility requirements and school policies for participation should be provided in writing to all students and parents. The purpose and philosophy of the school program should be reviewed with all parties involved.

Posters on How to Protect Your Eligibility shall be distributed to all member schools in August. Please post these in prominent locations. Extra copies are available from the MSHSAA office.

Check ACT & SAT Dates to Avoid Conflicts

High school counselors, principals, coaches and directors are urged to remind all high school students of the dates on which the ACT and SAT tests will be administered, as well as the dates of MSHSAA district and state events. MSHSAA event dates are contained in MSHSAA sport and activity manuals, the MSHSAA wall calendar and inside the back cover of the MSHSAA Handbook.

High school students participating in interscholastic activities often find conflicts between interscholastic events and the ACT and SAT test dates. Students can avoid this problem by arranging for a test date that does not conflict with an interscholastic event in which they will be participating.

2014 Area Meeting Report

The MSHSAA staff conducted eight Area Meetings during the month of January. Information gathered at these meetings was presented to the MSH-SAA Board of Directors at the January, 2014 meeting of the Board. Consideration was given for further action on the topics discussed. Below is a brief summary of discussion and overall opinions on the topics gathered at each of the eight sites.

1.	Should the Constitution be amended to prevent a redshirt year at an Affiliate Registered School?			
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	Two semesters of eligibility at each grade level - 15 in favor, 0 opposed, Several - no votes.		
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Nobody in the area plays affiliate registered schools.		
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	A few schools play against them (maybe 2). No concerns. 100% in favor.		
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	Very few in attendance are or play affiliate schools. Widespread approval.		
	Waynesville (South Central District):	One school is affiliate at the junior high level. 98% in favor of no red shirt year, 2% opposed.		
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	Very few members at junior high level.		
	Republic - (Southwest District):	Some discussion on gaining a competitive advantage. All in favor.		
	Dexter (Southeast District):	100% in favor of no red shirt year.		
2.	Should there be exceptions for two	non-school competitions in all individual sports?		
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	Individual should all be equal. Will we have more requests for additional non-school competition? Would the student be able to miss school time or practices? How many kids participated in wrestling during season? 99% in favor, 1 % opposed.		
	Mexico (Northeast District):	100% in favor of the change.		
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	No concerns. 100% in favor.		
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	Non-school competition - opening up a can of worms with wrestling. We let the other sports do it, the coaches should put restriction in. Fifty matches now, no need to pen it up. Ask sports separately. 98% in favor, 2% opposed.		
	Waynesville (South Central District):	Would be in favor to allow because of community benefit runs. 98% in favor, 2% opposed. If it starts with two does it expand? It is difficult to monitor. I can see where the track coaches would be concerned with this. Many of these are family runs and just for fun not competition.		
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	What opportunities are there for wrestling athletes? All-Star Meets. Would outside wrestling groups add events? 100% in favor.		
	Republic - (Southwest District):	In favor of allowing it because he has a daughter and doesn't see an issue with her participating. Would probably be opposed to it because they may want to run on a weekend when they need to rest. It could be an issue in wrestling with weight management. 70% in favor of allowing, 30% opposed. What about the consistency across the individual sports?		
	Dexter (Southeast District):	99% in favor, 1% opposed.		
3.	Should the Sportsmanship Summit	date and location be adjusted to insure better attendance?		
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	If the Sportsmanship Summit was at a different time about 15-20 schools would come, now only three schools participate. Hold it during the breaks between the seasons.		
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Rotate location and time of the year. Fall and Spring. Six schools in attendance have attended.		
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Centralized location would be nice. Fall sports cannot attend. The date is an issue, could move it from beginning of fall. Rotation allowed more schools to be involved. Most football coaches have something on Saturday. Central Location - 100%, Two summits - 99%, One summit - 1%, During dead period - 80%, Not during dead period - 20%.		
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	The date makes it impossible to attend with practice and staff in-service. 50% centralized, 20% rotation, 30% don't care. Beneficial with doing it during non-contact between fall and winter. The non-contact period before fall allow all athletes to be able to participate. Could there be two summits?		
	Waynesville (South Central District):	Does not matter on the rotation, but would make it nicer if it was centrally located. Because of location it can add expense because of hotels and food. Because it is a Saturday and fall athletes cannot miss practice. Benefit during the summer would allow the kids to use what they learn throughout the entire year. No consensus on when to have it.		
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	Central location is better. Would it be during the school year? Central - 99%. Were in favor of having two sportsmanship summits.		
	Republic - (Southwest District):	How about a simulcast? Don't think it matters on location. not sure the location is an issue as much as the date it is held. Hard to get fall sports students involved. Is it possible to have multiple locations? Time period during the Winter Non-Contact Period. The kids in fall sports may not be able to miss practice. A central location, many people could go and come back in same day. Before the school year, gets the focus for the year. Schedule it on a Wednesday.		
	Dexter (Southeast District):	When is the summit? What location has the best attendance? The timing of the summit makes it difficult to attend. How about the summit during dead period with least number of schools? The week prior to fall season beginning. Waive the dead period for this event. Majority prefer last dead period and not affect the dead period rule.

	North Andrew (Northwest District):	Validity was an issue. Need immediate feedback would help. Trouble getting it back. will it be public? 100% in favor, 0% opposed.
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Is there a penalty if you get a bad report? Some would like the input - maybe just from the lead official. See it broken dow by adult fans, student fans, coaches, administration. This would be good information - but only as good as what you do wi it.
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Fans would be hard to rate. You may be opening a door with the coach and officials and the kids in the middle. We alread have process in place. End of the year report? It needs to be mandatory if it happens. Three different ratings for coach/fans/players. We have a hard time getting officials now. Why pay attention to the crowd! Rating both schools. Can we ju do coaches/players? No intent to do anything with a school who has bad report (information only). One AD wanted them after the game so he could use the information. Schools give parameters and send it back to the Officials Advisory Comm tee. It is tit for tat its nonsense. 90% opposed.

Want people to go to their own school website. It takes 30 seconds to put a score in the system. 10% if favor, 40% opposed, 50% don't care.		
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	I like that idea and a portal for statistics. I would be OK to that so I don't have to do it on StL. As long as they can do one central location. Would the media be able to have access? What sports? What kind of time frame? This is about changing habits and would need to be mandated. Would there be fines? 90% in favor, 10% opposed. Different schools gather different stats and a program that is user friendly.		
	Republic - (Southwest District):	What is the time line? Can we mandate reporters look on the website? Just adds something for coaches to have to do. Media outlets could sign-up for scores to be sent to them automatically. Think it is a great thing, other states do this. Simplify the process for coaches to input score. Cancellation of games is a concern. If this is something we are supposed to do, put It on the home supervisor, not the coach. The tournament, the home supervisor for each game. 30% in favor, 70% opposed.

The MSHSAA Board of Directors circulates the Annual Questionnaire each year to all member schools. This instrument is utilized to obtain a consensus from member schools on key issues which will aid the Board of Directors in determining changes that are desired by the majority of member schools. Listed below are the results of this year's Annual Questionnaire.

- PROPOSAL 1 -

(Affiliate Registered Schools - Jr. High Students Repeating a Grade) (PASSED) - 477 FOR, 95 -AGAINST (2/3 majority needed for passage)

Amends Article III, Section 6, Affiliate Registered School, by disallowing students at Affiliate Registered Schools who are repeating a grade at the junior high level from participating in competitions against MSHSAA full member schools.

- PROPOSAL 2 -(Petition Requirements) (PASSED) - 443 FOR, 129 AGAINST (2/3 majority needed for passage)

Amends Article VI, Section 3, How Amendments May Be Proposed, by requiring a petition include signatures from ten percent of the entire MSHSAA membership, and that this total include signatures from at least ten percent of the member schools in at least five of the eight geographic Board districts, in order for the petition to be certified.

- PROPOSAL 3 -(Balloting Requirements) (PASSED) - 472 FOR, 100 AGAINST (2/3 majority needed for passage)

Amends Article VI, Section 4, Limitation on Balloting, by clarifying within the language that only schools that are controlled or restrained by the standing wording of the specific Constitution section(s) or by-law(s) that the amendment is addressing at the time of balloting may vote on the proposal.

- PROPOSAL 4 -(Heat Acclimatization - Junior High Schools) (PASSED) - 300 FOR, 41 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 1.7.2, Heat Acclimatization Requirements, to define "fall sport" for junior high schools as a sport with a first practice date prior to Monday of Week 11 (September 15, 2014).

- PROPOSAL 5 -(Citizenship Standards) (PASSED) - 533 FOR, 39 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 2.2.3, Citizenship Requirements, by specifically defining an expulsion and the accompanying period of ineligibility.

- PROPOSAL 6 -(Undue Influence) (PASSED) - 431 FOR, 141 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 2.6, Undue Influence, by including "the attempt" to influence a student to enroll or transfer as a violation, regardless of whether the student transfers as a result of the influence, and expands the language in the by-law describing the individuals/groups that must refrain from undue influence.

- PROPOSAL 7 -

(Coaching Requirements - Reorganization of By-Law) (PASSED) - 433 FOR, 139 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.1, Requirements for Athletic Coaches, by 1) more clearly outlining the requirements for head coaches, assistant coaches, student coaches and hardship coaches, and 2) including concussion, CPR and AED training within the by-law.

- PROPOSAL 8 -

(Coaching Requirements - Fundamentals of Coaching Course) - (FAILED) - 268 FOR, 304 AGAINST

Would have amended By-Law 3.1, Requirements for Athletic Coaches, by requiring all coaches to complete the NFHS Fundamentals of Coaching course.

- PROPOSAL 9 -

(Coaching Requirements - Sports First Aid / CPR / AED Requirement) - (PASSED) - 418 FOR, 154 AGAINST

Amends By-Laws 3.1, Requirements for Athletic Coaches, and 4.5.3, Spirit Coaches First Aid Requirement, by requiring that First Aid training be renewed every two years, and that CPR and AED training be required and renewed every two years.

- PROPOSAL 10 -(Permission for Non-School Competition During Season) (PASSED) - 377 FOR, 195 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.13.2, Organized Non-School Competition, by requiring prior administrator approval before a student could utilize any of the non-school competition allowances within the by-laws, such as continuing his/her summer non-school team practice or competition after fall practice has started (only until Labor Day) or participating in a club-team try-out one time during the school sport season.

- PROPOSAL 11-a -

(Allowance for Non-School Competitions During Season for Cross Country) (PASSED) - 461 FOR, 111 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.13.2, Organized Non-School Competition, by expanding the allowance for athletes to participate in two non-school competitions during the school sport season, as is currently allowed in golf and tennis, to the sport of cross-country.

- PROPOSAL 11-b -

(Allowance for Non-School Competitions During Season for Track and Field)
(PASSED) - 452 FOR, 120 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.13.2, Organized Non-School Competition, by expanding the allowance for athletes to participate in two non-school competitions during the school sport season, as is currently allowed in golf and tennis, to the sport of track and field.

- PROPOSAL 11-c -

(Allowance for Non-School Competitions During Season for Wrestling) (PASSED) - 352 FOR, 220 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.13.2, Organized Non-School Competition, by expanding the allowance for athletes to participate in two non-school competitions during the school sport season, as is currently allowed in golf and tennis, to the sport of wrestling.

- PROPOSAL 12 -(Football - Heat Acclimatization) (PASSED) - 385 FOR, 17 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.15.6, Football Activities, and deletes By-Law 3.23.4, Required Conditioning (football), correcting conflicts with language passed last year regarding required Heat Acclimatization.

- PROPOSAL 13 -(Volleyball Individual Player Limits) (PASSED) - 363 FOR, 78 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.25.1, Individual Player Limits, by increasing: 1) the volleyball daily set limitations for individual players in dual competition (non-tournament matches) to four sets per day, and increasing 2) the volleyball season set limitations for individual players to a number of sets that equals four times the number of duals played by the higher team on which the individual plays plus the corresponding number of tournaments.

- PROPOSAL 14 -(Wrestling - Individual Wrestler Limits) (PASSED) - 200 FOR, 48 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.26.1, Individual Wrestler Limits, by excluding forfeits from being counted toward the season maximum of 50 matches prior to Districts.

- PROPOSAL 15 -(Winter Season - First Allowable Contest) (PASSED) - 351 FOR, 158 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.28.3 a and b, Winter Sports Season - Standardized Dates, by changing the first allowable contest date for the sports of wrestling and basketball, from a Monday to a Friday (three days earlier).

- PROPOSAL 16 -

(Girls Swimming and Diving - First Allowable Practice Date and First Allowable Contest Date)

(PASSED) - 96 FOR, 34 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 3.28.3.c, Winter Sports Season - Standardized Dates, by moving the first allowable practice date for Girls Swimming and Diving one week earlier (to the Monday following the Boys State Championships), and moving the first allowable contest date one week earlier and also changing it from a Monday to a Friday.

- PROPOSAL 17 -(Peer Review Committee) (PASSED) - 405 FOR, 167 AGAINST

Adds By-Law 5.3, Peer Review Committee and Membership, by adding language authorizing the Board of Directors to form a local Peer Review Committee as an option in a situation where an official complaint has been received and evidence supports that a school violation has taken place, in order to intervene and/or assist in corrective action with the offending school.

- PROPOSAL 18 -(Penalty for Ejected Coach) (PASSED) - 370 FOR, 202 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 5.5, Conduct, by requiring a coach who has been ejected from a contest to complete an approved online sportsmanship training course prior to being reinstated.

- PROPOSAL 19 -

(Submitted by Petition: Four Classes for Boys and Girls Soccer) (PASSED) - 277 FOR, 235 AGAINST

Amends By-Law 5.1.4, Classifications, by excluding, the sport of soccer from the requirement of having 257 schools registered for the sport in order to qualify for four classifications, and adds a new By-Law 5.1.14 mandating four classifications for soccer despite the number of schools registered.

-- 1) Recommended the proposal from the Advertising sub-committee, shown below, be taken forward to other committees and groups for feedback and discussion; 2) Recommended a proposal for the Board to go to the Area Meetings in January and on the Annual Questionnaire that would to do the following: (a) Alter the non-public school attendance boundary requirement, which is currently an area not to exceed a 25 mile radius measured from the school principal's office, and to instead utilize the public high school's boundaries in which the non-public school sits as its attendance boundary in order to define "resident" students and "non-resident" students. (b) Remove the current non-public/charter school multiplier of 1.35 for official enrollment calculations and replace it with a multiplier for all member schools based on resident students (no multiplier) and non-resident students (a multiplier to be determined based on data gathered, such as 1.4 to 1.8) in order to calculate official school enrollment for classification purposes. January 23, 2014 -- 1) By consensus, the committee recommended the following series of questions for the Annual Questionnaire to the Board of Directors: (a) Questionnaire Topic 1: A series of questions in regard to the perceived "effectiveness" of the current multiplier in the eyes of the membership. (b) Questionnaire Topic 2: A series of questions in regard to the possible use of an enrollment "subtractor" affecting enrollment by the number of students on free and reduced lunch accounts, special needs students, differences in socio-economic percentages, etc. (c) Questionnaire Topic 3: A series of questions in regard to the use of a "Championship Factor" and sustained success. (d) Questionnaire Topic 4: A series of questions in regard to the use of a "Peer Review" process to deal with Undue Influence. (e). Questionnaire Topic 5: A series of questions in regard to strengthening the definition of undue influence to include "the attempt to influence" as a violation, regardless of whether the student transfers. (f) Questionnaire Topic 6: A series of questions in regard to boundary options for non-public schools: current 25 mile radius, smaller, proposed change (public school's), etc. 2) Questionnaire Topic 6: (Not by consensus) Recommended a series of questions for the Annual Questionnaire in regard to modifying the promotion exception within the transfer standards, as per the committee's original proposal. The length of restricted eligibility (one

year versus two years) should be included.

NOTE: Action to be taken by the MSHSAA Board regarding the Public/Nonpublic Advisory Committee recommendations will be made with the discussion for the Annual Questionnaire items later in the meeting.

Urhahn reported to the Board on a self-reported school violation involving Rock Bridge High School. Urhahn noted he would like to get a copy of the school's investigation once it is completed.

NOTE: Action will be taken by the MSHSAA Board on Rock Bridge High School's reported violation following receipt of the school's selfinvestigation report is received.

Urhahn discussed with the Board information he has gathered on the NFHS national network. While MSHSAA content will be shown on the network portal, the Association will not be an official member of the network. No action was taken.

Approved the 2013 November and December financial statements as presented.

The Board received the minutes from the Constitution Study Committee, Cross Country Advisory Committee, Football Advisory Committee and the Middle-Level Advisory Committee. Those committees did not make any recommendations for the Board to take action on.

Garner reported to the Board on six recommendations from the Soccer Advisory Committee: 1) Recommend to the Officials Advisory Committee that they remind officials to provide their name, official ID number and field position to both schools prior to each game; 2) Recommend to increase field requirements to a minimum of 62 yards by 110 yards for all sectional and quarterfinal games. If the host school does not have a field with the minimum dimensions and is unable to obtain a suitable field with the required dimensions at no cost to MSHSAA, the opposing school will have the opportunity to host. If both schools mutually agree to play on a smaller field they may do so; 3) Recommend that an option is added to the electronic officials rating system for soccer to allow a coach to differentiate between a center and an AR position. AMENDED: Send recommendation to the Officials Advisory and look at cost of changing website; 4) Recommend that the coach also receives an e-mail notification for yellow/red cards issued in addition to the AD. The AD is still required to respond, but the coach gets notification also; 5) Recommend to allow soccer preseason scrimmages to take place between Friday of week #6 and Thursday of week #7 for boys and between Friday of week #35 and Thursday of week #36 for girls; 6) Recommend to publish each school's total number of yellow/red cards issued for each season in the Journal, and look at ways to recognize schools in the future with a low card count. Perhaps in the future send

this idea to the Sportsmanship Committee to create ways to promote and reward fair play in soccer. AMENDED: A summary of all sports unsportsmanlike reports will be sent to each school's principal and athletic director.

Schools Need for Emergency Approval of Non-Faculty Music Directors

By-Law 4.2.3 specifies that non-faculty music directors must meet the same qualifications as non-faculty coaches.

To qualify as a head music director, an individual must hold a valid teacher's certificate. To qualify as an assistant non-faculty music director (any non-faculty director that provides music instruction) said individual must hold a valid substitute teacher's certificate. In addition, each non-faculty music director must be approved annually by the Board of Directors. The school must list the individual's name on the coaches and directors link. This link is located on the MSHSAA website under the schools tab.

A music director is defined as someone who provides music instruction only. An auxiliary director/flag sponsor, etc. is not considered a music director, and approval is not required for these positions. A drumline instructor would need approval and must meet the above criteria.

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

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MIAAA/NIAAA Student-Athlete Scholarship Recipients

The two Missouri NIAAA Scholarship Essay winners for 2014 were seniors Joshua Jacobsen of Lawson High School and Kelsey Tepen from Eureka High School. Both student-athletes had outstanding essays and athletic credentials, as did many applicants. These student-athletes also had an outstanding record of civic duty. Their athletic directors spoke highly of their ability to give back to their community and of their devotion to other organizations within, and outside of, the school.

Kelsey Tepen was a 3 sport athlete and earned 7 Varsity Letters. She was an All-State Softball player helping her team to the Final Four and carried a 3.8 GPA. In her essay, Kelsey credited her experiences with sports for shaping much of her life. He is able to prioritize the high demands of today's student athlete to maximize success in the classroom and on the field."

Kelsey and Joshua both received a \$1000.00 scholarship from the MIAAA and presented their essays at the MIAAA Spring Conference Banquet, which was held April 6, 2014 at Tan-Tar-A Resort in Osage Beach, MO. Their essays will go on to compete for an additional \$1500.00 scholarship at the NIAAA Section V

meeting in Omaha, NE June 3-4, 2014. Their essays will compete with the scholarship winners from Kansas, Nebraska, South Dakota, North Dakota, and Minnesota. The Section V winners move on to compete for the \$2000.00 NIAAA national scholarship later in the summer of 2010.

This year, the MIAAA also presented two runner-up awards of \$5000.00 each. The female runner-up was Madeleine Weber of Monett High School, Daryl Bradley athletic Director. The male runner-up was Jayden Happel of Fair Grove High School, Jason O'Neal athletic director.
