- 1. Form for 2021-22 Tournaments is on the website. (Maurer)
- 2. Coaches do NOT agree with kids being able to go in and out of the screen. (Oesch)
- 3. In the event we are still virtual, Readers Theatre should be an event. (Oesch)
- 4. Access to videos should be allowed to coaches and students in a way that protesting can be done. (Oesch)
- 5. At virtual tournaments, out of state schools do not need to register with MSHSAA or fill out paperwork if school certifies they are following MSHSAA rules. (Higgins)
- 6. Online tournament clarification. (Whyte)
- 7. Virtual Tournaments: Synchronous events whenever possible. (Beck)
- 8. MSHSAA should have granted the request to increase the number of qualifiers to State when the majority of us showed a significant decrease in participation. (Oesch)
- 9. Expand the number of events (one debate event, one theatre event and two individual events) that a student is allowed to enter in the District Tournament and subsequently the State Tournament. (Kappeler)
- 10. Add POI and Informative Speaking as MSHSAA events. (Whyte)
- 11. Add INFO. (Higgins)
- 12. MSHSAA offering clear guidelines about what in-person tournaments should include in terms of safety. (Beck/Clubbs)
- 13. MSHSAA decision in January of 2022 regarding virtual vs. in-person district and state tournaments. (Beck)
- 14. Debate Prep Time: Adopt the following increases to prep time to align with NSDA rules (Policy 8 minutes/PF 3 minutes). (Beck)
- 15. Change PFD 3rd place speeches to 3 minutes (Higgins/Beck/Whyte)
- 16. Change the way district/state tournament is run to delay or direct power match Rounds 3 and 4. (Higgins)
- 17. Clarification on internet usage in a round. (Whyte)
- 18. MSHSAA strongly encouraging schools to use the NDCA novice evidence packet for novice Policy competition during the first semester. (Whyte)
- 19. Adopt an anti-bias statement (similar to that of the NSDA) and put it in the MSHSAA manual and on all ballots. (Beck)
- 20. Create a statewide list of folks who should not be judging at tournaments because they have engaged in inappropriate activity and/or have carried actions that make students unsafe. (Beck)
- 21. Encourage every invitational and require the district and state tournaments to have equity officers NOT the tournament director (and ideally not a coach). (Beck)
