MSHSAA Adjusts Remaining Schedule For Spring Softball Championships

SPRINGFIELD – The Missouri State High School Activities Association (MSHSAA) has adjusted the remaining schedule of the 2025 Spring Softball Championships due to inclement weather.

The Class 2 Semifinal matchup between Kennett and Diamond was officially concluded by the umpires due to inclement weather, in accordance with Section 4.2 of the NFHS Softball Rules Book.

“If a game ends because of weather conditions, or darkness interferes with play so that the game is called (ended) by the umpire, it is a regulation game provided five full innings have been played.”

At the end of five innings, Diamond led Kennett 8-7, making it the final result.

The schedule tomorrow will go as follows.

- Class 1 Third Place Game (will resume): 10 a.m.
- Class 2 Third Place Game: 70 minutes after the conclusion of the Class 1 Third Place Game
- Class 1 Championship Game: 70 minutes after the conclusion of the Class 2 Third Place Game
- Class 2 Championship Game: 70 minutes after the conclusion of the Class 1 Championship Game

The spectator gates will open at 9 a.m.
