Appeals Committee Summaries

Held January 22, 2016

The Appeals Committee heard one case via telephone conference call and ruled as follows:

a. Denied appeal to grant eligibility to the following school's student under Article IV, Section 6-p, Hardship Provision of the MSHSAA Constitution, By-Law 2.4 (Semesters):

1. Belton High School

Held February 8, 2016

The Appeals Committee heard one case via telephone conference call and ruled as follows:

a. Denied appeal to grant unrestricted eligibility to the following school's student (transfer was deemed as not being made for athletic reasons or undue influence) under provisions contained in MSHSAA By-Law 3.10.4.h, Hardship Application Transfers and granted restricted eligibility under Transfer Waiver, By-Law 3.10.4.i:

1. St. Mary's (St. Louis) High School

c. Denied appeal to grant eligibility to the following school's student under provisions contained in MSHSAA By-Law 3.10.4.i, Waiver Application, due to transfers being deemed as being made for athletic reasons:

Held April 6, 2016

The Appeals Committee heard one case via telephone conference call and ruled as follows:

a. Granted unrestricted eligibility to the following schools' students under provisions contained in MSHSAA By-Law 3.10.4.h, Hardship Application Transfers (transfer was deemed as not being made for athletic reasons or undue influence):

1. Chadwick High School (two student appeals)

Coach Defined

A coach is one who provides any type of instruction specific to a sport or activity. All coaches, paid or not paid, must be submitted online. Such person shall, therefore, meet the standards for coaching in the interscholastic program as provided in By-Laws 3.1 through 3.1.10. A coach must be "approved" by the MSHSAA office prior to instructing students. An egregious or intentional violation of the MSHSAA by-laws or the rules/regulations of the sport may cause the Board of Directors to withhold "approved" status.

Online Rules Review Requirement

Each school shall be responsible for requiring all coaches (as defined in By-Laws 3.1 through 3.1.10) to complete a MSHSAA Online Rules Review, except for those coaching an emerging sport. When a coach does not complete the online rules review within the time allowed, there will be a \$50 fine per coach to open the review.

QUESTIONS & ANSWERS

The following are questions and answers pertaining to the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws and/or MSHSAA Board of Directors policy. These are provided as an aid in interpreting the rules and regulations which MSHSAA member schools have adopted. If you have a specific area and/or question which you would like explained, contact Dr. Kerwin Urhahn, MSHSAA executive director. Your attention is called to the fact questions and answers regarding interpretations of the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws appear following the Constitution Article or By-Law they relate to in the MSHSAA Official Handbook.

Question: Our school district supports three high schools. Our Board of Education will permit and grant requests from students to attend a high school in which their parents' residence is not located in that high school's established geographic attendance area. The family does, however, reside in the school district. Would this scenario fall within the requirements of residence in MSHSAA By-Law 3.10.2?

Answer: No. The by-laws carefully define residence as being within the established geographic attendance area for the individual member school and not an entire school district of multiple schools at the same level. In the situation described, the students would be initially ineligible until a transfer form is submitted to determine athletic eligibility in all sports. Non-resident freshmen may be ruled eligible under the "promotion" transfer exception, but they are still considered transfer students if they live outside of the individual high school's boundaries, and a transfer request must be filed.

Question: Our school encourages our students to use our weight room for out of season conditioning. Our athletic coaches take roll of their student athletes and expect them to participate in this program. If the students do not attend the coaches counsel with them that they should be there for the good of the team. Is this appropriate action by our coaches?

Answer: Participation in an out-of-season conditioning program is completely voluntary and must be open to any student who desires to attend. Taking roll for team attendance is signaling to the students a record of team member attendance is being kept even though the activity is voluntary. The follow-up with the students and so called "counseling" to attend has definitely tied participation with team responsibility outside of the season. The adults have implied to the students they are expected to attend and this is a responsibility to the team.

Because there is a fine line that can be crossed, school administrators must educate their coaches of what is appropriate and must monitor carefully the out-of-season conditioning programs.

As the school year draws to a close, the MSHSAA will host the last of this year's Championships. music, academic competition, speech & debate, boys tennis, baseball, and girls soccer will be crowning young people from all over the state. These championships could not take place without the help of numerous volunteers.

A special thanks is indeed in order to the many individuals who combined their energies, efforts and talents to conduct our interscholastic programs. On behalf of the MSHSAA Board of Directors and your MSHSAA staff, we truly appreciate your dedication to our young people and the work you do throughout the year. Through the experiences our young people encounter through participation, the skills and lessons of life are taught. Your endeavors to provide enjoyable and worthwhile experiences to our boys and girls has afforded them a valuable opportunity to apply what they are learning through their education. Thank you and enjoy the summer!

Question: Our football coaches have worked out a schedule for the summer and have divided up the duties to give them some time off at home with their families. The head coach is going to work with the team on Mondays and Wednesdays and play seven-on-seven on Saturdays. Our assistant coaches are going to open up the weight room on Tuesdays and Thursdays. We would also like to host our own full contact camp the fourth week in July for four days. a) Do we have to count all of these days as contact days? b) Can our assistant coaches go to the games on Saturdays? and c) when does the summer period end?

Answer: A) the days that the coach or any coach from that sport is giving instruction will be counted as a contact day therefore; the head coach would have to count his days as contact days. If the assistant coaches are following By-Law 3.15 for out-of-sport conditioning they will not be counted towards the contact days. However, if sport specific instruction takes place they will count as contact days. Example: Weight training is over and the kickers go and get a couple of balls and practice kicking out on the field ;contact has occurred for that sport. B) Your assistants can attend any function. The school must keep track of sport specific contact. Any football contact, with instruction is considered one day of contact. You can have three coaches with three different sets of students from the same school doing different things on the same day and that is one day of contact. C) for fall sports the summer ends July 31. For all other sports the summer ends with the Sunday of week six of the standardized calendar.

Question: Who cannot coach a nonschool team during the school year outside a particular sport's school season?

Answer: No member of the coaching staff of any sport (not just the sport in question) from any school that any student on the nonschool team currently attends or will attend the following year can coach this particular nonschool team during the school outside the specific sport's school season (MSHSAA By-Law 3.14.2.e).

Question: Is there a difference to the rule mentioned in the question above if the nonschool competition occurs in the summer after school is dismissed for the summer:

Answer: Yes, during the summer months, the nonschool team participants in any sport may be coached by a member of the schools coaching staff of the school the nonschool participant has attended the previous school year or will attend the next school year (MSHSAA By-Law 3.15.3 Editor's Note).

Summer School Questions & Answers

Summer school courses and credit earned may count toward academic eligibility if specific requirements are met. The individual school district must first adopt an official position that summer school credit shall be accepted. The policy on summer school credit should be placed in writing and readily provided for informational purposes to parents and students. It should be made clear that correspondence school courses and electives do not meet this requirement.

The following questions and answers should be helpful and shared with your school counselors.

Question: Will students be able to count summer school credit toward meeting the academic eligibility requirements for the first semester of the 2016-2017 school year?

Answer: Yes. By-Law 2.3 provides students may count up to 1 unit of credit from summer school toward establishing their eligibility for the fall semester. Only classes, which are required for graduation from the local school, may be counted toward meeting the academic requirement. Electives are not accepted.

Question: Should we have some type of a form that our counselors may want to use to advise the student and parents if the class(es) being taken in summer school will or will not count toward regaining academic eligibility?

Answer: Absolutely. The counseling department and the school athletic and activities directors must all work together to be certain students are advised properly before taking the class. If any questions arise the MSHSAA office should be contacted. (573-875-4880).

Question: If a student needs 1 unit of credit in physical education and has earned that credit by the end of the sophomore year, may the student take physical education during the summer after the junior year as an elective and count this credit toward re-establishing his academic eligibility?

Answer: No. Only classes required for graduation as set form by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education (DESE) and/or the local school may be counted in summer school. Electives would not count toward regaining eligibility.

Question: May one of our students take summer school in another district and count the credit earned towards eligibility?

Answer: Yes, provided the class is required for graduation and your school is going to accept the credit and place on the student's transcript.

Question: If one of our student's fails Algebra I must that student take Algebra I in summer school or could the student take a required science class if Algebra I is not being offered?

Answer: A student is not required to take the same class failed during the school year. The student may retake the class during summer school, but it is not required. The only requirement for a summer school class to be counted towards academic eligibility is that the class is a graduation requirement for the school and cannot be an elective.

Question: Is it mandatory that our school accept summer school credit for determining academic eligibility for the fall semester?

Answer: No. This like all other requirements of student eligibility are the minimum essential requirements and each local Board of Education/Governing Body has the right to establish more stringent requirements.

Question: What is meant by the core classes required for graduation by DESE?

Answer: In order for all students across the state to meet a minimal curricular program it was adopted by the schools to rely upon core courses and required credits for graduation as required by the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education. Currently these minimum requirements are as follows: Practical Arts = 1 credit; Fine Arts = 1 credit; Physical Education = 1 credit; Science = 2 credits; Mathematics = 2 credits; Communication Arts = 3 credits; and Social Studies = 2 credits. In addition a student may also count other required classes.

MSHSAA Summer Hours

MSHSAA summer office hours will take effect on Monday, May 23. Monday through Thursday, the office will be open from 7:30 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The office will not be open to the public on Fridays during the summer. The building is open to walk-in customers during all hours of operation, Monday through Thursday.

Regular office hours of 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., all weekdays, will resume August 1.

How Do Students and Parents Learn the Eligibility Requirements?

An incoming seventh grader or ninth grader enters your school with anticipation of activity participation. It is her first opportunity to be a part of an interscholastic program. The student and the parents are unaware of academic requirements, semesters of participation, age requirements, nonschool competition requirements, amateur and awards standards, etc. How are our young people and their parents to learn of the eligibility requirements necessary to earn and maintain student eligibility? How do they learn about the interscholastic program, its purpose and philosophy? This is essential.

It is the responsibility of the staff of each member school to properly advise and educate the students and their parents of the eligibility requirements. The youngsters in our programs are placed in a vulnerable position when the school administration and activities staff do not review and clarify the eligibility rules and the purpose and philosophy of our programs.

Member schools should make certain that students expecting to compete in their school's athletic and activity programs clearly understand the standards of eligibility. As an aid in properly informing students, the MSHSAA annually publishes a brochure entitled "How to Protect Your High School Eligibility." A copy of this brochure is sent to all member schools in the August packet each year and with the sport rule book mailings. Member schools may make copies or order a supply from the MSHSAA office at a minimal cost per copy to cover the costs of printing and postage. The information can also be found at www.mshsaa.org.

All students participating in athletics and activities should be given one of these brochures as standard procedure. In addition, coaches and directors should take time to review the pamphlet with members of their sports squads and activities groups to explain all eligibility requirements. Eligibility requirements and school policies for participation should be provided in writing to all students and parents. The purpose and philosophy of the school program should be reviewed with all parties involved.

Posters on How to Protect Your Eligibility shall be distributed to all member schools in August. Please post these in prominent locations. Extra copies are available from the MSHSAA office.

Check ACT & SAT Dates to Avoid Conflicts

High school counselors, principals, coaches and directors are urged to remind all high school students of the dates on which the ACT and SAT tests will be administered, as well as the dates of MSHSAA district and state events. MSHSAA event dates are contained in MSHSAA sport and activity manuals, the MSHSAA wall calendar and inside the back cover of the MSHSAA Handbook.

High school students participating in interscholastic activities often find conflicts between interscholastic events and the ACT and SAT test dates. Students can avoid this problem by arranging for a test date that does not conflict with an interscholastic event in which they will be participating.

2016 Area Meeting Report

The MSHSAA staff conducted eight Area Meetings during the month of January. Information gathered at these meetings was presented to the MSHSAA Board of Directors at the January, 2016 meeting of the Board. Consideration was given for further action on the topics discussed. Below is a brief summary of discussion and overall opinions on the topics gathered at each of the

1. Why We Play?	
North Andrew (Northwest District):	Those in attendance discussed among themselves topics such as difficulty in filling coaching openings with educators creating the necessity or turn to non-faculty personnel to fill these openings. Other concerns were the growing popularity of some athletes specializing in one sport and also just the general overall decline in students participating in extra-curricular activities. What can the MSHSAA do to help you as member schools? Not much feedback to question as many recognized that the details and nuances to these issues are different from school to school and probably cannot be fixed with a blanket approach. Question was brought forward as to whether there were any organizations or associations that have any type of reward program for students athletes that commit to participating in a sport/activity for all 4 years of their high school career. This question was brought forward as many felt that currently athletes are asked to do so much outside the season. Some felt that the borderline student athletes that may never be a varsity team starter ends up quitting participation because of the demands not only in season but also out of season.
Mexico (Northeast District):	Burn out from youth sports. Message out to community and parents more (younger). Elementary program - interested. Non-Faculty - 75% have to utilize - They believe school responsibility to train. Fewer athletes are coaching - burn out. Coaches specializing. Fewer teachers want to coach. Keeping up with the Joneses - Sunday practice, etc.
Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Some schools have job descriptions for coaches. Concern with outside factors pouring into school (i.e. club coaches, etc.). Club influence on high school sports. Wants us to continue providing information towards the goal.
Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	No comments.
Waynesville (South Central District):	Presentations at the beginning of each season and explain the rules of coaches, students, parents. (5 Star DVD) Josh Scott talked about how it's started their program. Greg Dale's - 10 Traits of Success. MSBA and Kerwin working on job descriptions and purpose statement. AAU making good money - pushing their programs.
McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	Appreciated work being done. (No discussion) Agreement with program.
Republic - (Southwest District):	Job descriptions - less than 10% for coaches. No discussion. Club sport issues - promise of success raises unrealistic expectations. Purpose/mission statement. In favor of moving forward - 80%.
Dexter (Southeast District):	No comments.
2. Academic Requirements - Do we need to look at how academic eligibility is being determined to give more flexibility to the schools?	
North Andrew (Northwest District):	A lot of conversation on this topic with a wide range of both concerns and support for the 80% requirement being handled locally while a number in attendance felt that the current academic requirement works and is acceptable. Several agreed that the number of ways students can earn academic credit continues to grow and that many schools do indeed accept a number of different ways for students to earn credit toward their transcript for graduation. However, when discussing whether we should move in a direction of simply requiring a student to simply attend 2 classes in the physical school building as part of the academic requirement most felt that is a direction they do not want to go for several reasons, mostly due to the philosophy that it is still important to be in attendance the majority of the time "at school". The majority not in favor of simply requiring a student to physically attend school for 2 class periods in fear of becoming wide open for home school students. In favor of more seat time in the high school building versus "how" credit is earned: Approximately 25% in attendance are in favor of seat time being the most important piece toward being eligible. In favor of current academic eligibility requirement: Approximately 70% in attendance says what we have works. In favor of maintaining higher expectation of seat time but flexibility for school determining what counts as credit on transcript for academic eligibility: Approximately 80% in attendance says this approach is acceptable. In favor of keeping our approach towards homeschool students participation separated from academic requirement for on campus students: 90-95% agreed that what we require from on campus students for academic eligibility needs to stay separate from our approach on how to handle participation for home school students. Suggestions for how to keep the topic of academic eligibility and home school eligibility separate from each other: It was suggested that the MSHSAA attempt to work with DESE on "one" set standard curriculum that a home school student would be accountable for taking and completing in order to be eligible to participate at a member school. Many agreed that there are some legitimate homeschool settings while others do not have any accountability. In other words - if a homeschool student wants to be eligible to participate in athletics/activities - then they have to follow this one set standard curriculum recognized by MSHSAA member schools.
Mexico (Northeast District):	(Academic and Homeschooling - topic 7 - discussed together) 80% - Required registration and (2) seat time at your building, your faculty - 6 votes. One AD thought they were losing the battle with home school students and let them participate. Pressure to accept the home school curriculum by the school. Home school students would then earn a diploma? 50% of your time in the building or more. If we make it too easy will more students go to home schooling? Kids not on campus lose the connection. Is 2 enough - 4 votes. More than 2 - 30 votes.
Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Some online/out of building classes is a good thing. If go to one credit in building are they considered our student? Concern with going below "50% in school credit." Some schools do not have opportunity to take advance/offer advance class. Difficult to determine eligibility with online or college courses. Equity issues small school vs. large school (i.e. opportunities). Impact on attendance requirement favored.
Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	Would this allow homeschoolers? Want to see them; know what they're up to. If we approve and transcript it - OK. Coaches not in building either. Difference - high school course and college course. Four block - 100% - need more flexibility. NCAA has to have certified teacher - ours unapproved - may need to take elsewhere. About 50%/50%.

	Waynesville (South Central District):	Do you want this flexibility? 2/majority. Come to our schools and be with our teachers. Look at #1 our kids should be in the building. If I can get a home schooler in my building I have a better chance of getting them in our programs and schools. How about school flex time?
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	Kids never on campus (Normandy). No discussion. More flexible - local decision - 10%, opposed - 30%.
	Republic - (Southwest District):	Ability to offer more (dual credit, etc.) Provide more flexibility. Some discussion on local school decisions of classes. Flexible, 10%, Same - 30%.
	Dexter (Southeast District):	Not having on campus circumvents the process and buy in. Could it count for attendance? Farmington for every day or every other day. For - 20%, Opposed - 0%, Noncommittal - 80%.
3.	Updating Schedules on MSHSAA Website - Should a fine be put into place for schools that do not update scores on its schedule page(s) in a timely manner?	
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	A number of comments and concerns were made for requiring scores to be posted within 24 hours, or receive a fine. Most believed that we have bigger issues on plates other than when a final score is being posted for a regular season game. Some mentioned that they thought we already fine for incomplete district entries which includes "season record". -In favor of requiring posting games scores within 24 hours or receive \$25 penalty: 5% in favor, others vocally opposed.
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Most agree that scores should be mandatory. A few in favor of fine. Football has incentive to put in - rankings. Tiered: 1st - reminder, 2nd low fine, 3rd - higher fine. Longer timeline than 24 hours except for media needs - need 24 hours.
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Twenty-four hours is too quick, should be 72 hours. They could take care of it if they wanted (media) - media does not cover. People should put schedules up early. If schedules are not up by beginning of the season then fine. Don't open eligibility roster available until schedule posted. Make a spreadsheet so all things are seen.
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	The mobile website helps, but would like one site to put the information on. Can we link them: Why do we need the scores: Why not use power rankings? Auto e-mail response for missing scores.
	Waynesville (South Central District):	No one in favor of a fine or doing this. Hard to keep up with. If we want coaches to do this, use the power rankings.
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	100% opposed. Could an e-mail alert go to the administrator when scores are not posted?
	Republic - (Southwest District):	100% opposed to a fine.
	Dexter (Southeast District):	If they don't put them in, what happens? Not a big issue. Twenty-four hours is not enough time, need more time. Maybe 48 hours would be better, like the idea. What happens when the website is not working? If they are teaching, may not be able to call if they are having issues. Don't think it is a problem. We don't need to collect data if they are not going to use it. Noon Monday for the previous weeks. The need for schedules to be on the website. Allows others to see where schools are open. Want games to be linked. Home game and tournament host. In favor - 90% would like scores but more time.
4.	Basketball - Should the by-law be changed to allow students to play in two tournaments during the same week? (cannot be on two teams in the same tournament)	
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	This discussion went rather quickly. It was evident right away that the schools wanted flexibility in a student being able to play in more than one basketball tournament in the same week, obviously due to the players that start/play JV but is also used a sub player on varsity. -In favor of allowing a basketball player to participate in more than one tournament in the same week: 85-90% in favor of change and allowing more than one tournament.
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Remove restriction? Majority - Yes.
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Questions about why we have it. What if a coach plays down just to win? JV players may sit out the JV tournament just to sit the bench in case they were needed. 99% in favor of removing it.
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	Why would they want to play in two tournaments? You dress kids because they are short on kids. When numbers are low, it makes it tough for coaches when needing to use JV kids. Majority 100% in favor.
	Waynesville (South Central District):	Another issue is when dealing with weather. 98% in favor, 2% opposed.
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	How many tournaments will it count as? The season limit will not change. 80% in favor of change, 20% opposed.
	Republic - (Southwest District):	85% in favor of change. 15% leave as is.
	Dexter (Southeast District):	What about JV and varsity tournaments going on in a conference? What about quarters in a day? Does the individual tournaments change? 30% in favor, 70% opposed to change.
5.	Cash Awards - Should cash awards for Music and other Activities that go to the school be allowed?	
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	Not much feedback either for against the allowance of cash rewards to a school from competitive/evaluative music events. In favor of allowing cash rewards to the school for competitive/evaluative music events: 25% in favor. Opposed: 0% which indicated that 80% didn't care either way on whether it should be permitted or restricted.
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Allow the cash award back to the school - Majority - Yes.
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Do we look at it for sports as well as activities? If they have money to give back, why don't they reduce entry fees? Why would they give money back if they are using it for fund raiser? Doesn't that go against why we do this? It is not about winning. It is all about the big shiny trophy at the end. If we allow cash prizes, then it may cause more travel and expenses to go to them. Could be done in the summer. 50%/50%.
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	Could it be allowed in sports? Did it come from the advisory committees? Does it have a dollar limit? 100% in favor.
	Waynesville (South Central District):	Where does that money come from? Majority OK with it.
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	What are they winning now? Why can't the school say no? 70% in favor, 30% opposed.

	Republic - (Southwest District):	20% in favor, 5% opposed.
	Dexter (Southeast District):	What do we do for sports? It needs to go to the school and not the individual. 50% in favor, 20% opposed.
6.	<i>Drug Testing - What are the membership's views and perspectives on required random drug testing for all student athletes in the state to ensure safety?</i>	
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	Since this topic was discussed at the MSHSAA 101 meeting in the fall of 2015, there was not much detailed conversation on whether drug test should or should not be mandated. It is clear that schools believe that this should be a local school decision on how to handle drug testing. -How many schools currently complete drug testing? 25% already have a drug testing procedure/policy. In favor of having a uniform drug testing policy/requirement in place for all member schools: 0%. In favor of drug testing being handled by local school policy/decision: 100% believe this is to be handled at the local school level.
	Mexico (Northeast District):	75% test now in some form. Four people - Yes - rest - No. Those "Yes" because their Board won't.
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Random drug testing done by several schools. Concern with trying to keep up with testing agencies regarding synthetic drugs. Cost for testing ranging \$10-\$25. Would penalties be the same across the board for all schools? This would be an unfunded mandate. Majority opposed to this item - 90%.
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	About 15 or so do drug testing now. Concerns about funding. Random or all - lots of decisions - which participants - sports, activities, all students. FERPA concerns - need to restrict access to information. Local is better due to different circumstances. All opposed.
	Waynesville (South Central District):	Most already drug test. Chris - 3 years, Don't get very many. It may be a cost we don't need. Maybe there aren't that many because there is a policy. Cost is an issue. Zero in favor of a statewide policy.
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	40% now test. Reasons for not testing - cost, parental decision, parents will request testing. Yes - 2%, no - 98%.
	Republic - (Southwest District):	How many test - 50-60%. Reason for not testing: cost, who to test (only athletes), community push back. In favor of by-law - 1% or less. Opposed - 80%.
	Dexter (Southeast District):	Institute when they pay for it. What percent of students? What would be the penalty? Who drug tests - 40-45% currently. Wouldn't like to be mandated. Shut down testing 1 out of 3 months. \$25 per test. 0 in favor, 100% opposed.
7.	<i>Home School Student Participation - Does the membership feel there is a manner in which home school students could represent and compete for a MSHSAA member school in interscholastic competition?</i>	
	North Andrew (Northwest District):	Discussion did not last very long on this topic due to Topic 2 spilling over into discussion on eligibility of home school students. Again, most in attendance agreed and asked if the MSHSAA can attempt to work with DESE on "one" set standard curriculum that a home school student would be accountable for taking and completing in order to be eligible to participate at a member school. Many agreed that there are some legitimate homeschool settings while other do not have any accountability. In other words - If a homeschool student wants to be eligible to participate in athletics/activities - then they have to follow this one set standard curriculum recognized by MSHSAA member schools.
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Discussed with topic 2 (Academics).
	Smith-Cotton (Central District):	If this comes to pass that Jefferson City gathers momentum to push this through - schools strongly support that MSHSAA create By-Law rather than Jefferson City. Concern with impact on transfer rule and equity on accountability. Maybe we should look deeper at 50% attendance to show legislature we are looking at it. With this change create a bigger riff between public and nonpublic.
	Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	Legislature doesn't regulate them - not fair. Could lose kids to homeschooling if allowed. Lose funding - ADA. Joe Aull explained the misunderstanding of legislature on requirements - they hear from the homeschoolers a lot and from schools less. Need other standards besides accepting credit - more tie-ins of kids to school. How would this affect non-publics? Enrollment numbers - how to count homeschoolers? Slippery slope - unlevels the playing field. No way to keep it equitable. No oversight.
	Waynesville (South Central District):	What if they come out for the team and you cut them? Will we lose students to home schooling? Why should an athlete represent a school they don't attend? Are we producing athletes or students? Did the move to allowing home school associations to participate hold? (Yes) Do you understand why we bring this topic up? (Yes)
	McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	Must meet minimum - 2 hours. if their schedule includes core courses and they can pass school administered exams. Question number or percent of kids being home schooled. Should there be a home school activities program? Based on number being home schooled. Need for residency - as it relates to nonpublic school participation. End of course exam to be administered at school of residence. Will kids be accepted as member of team? Tests scores effect on. Schools set up to fail if kids cannot make teams or cannot play (privilege vs. right). Number of states that allow participation (28). Concern - student is failing in class and ineligible - drops out to be home schooled and requests eligibility. Home school credit and NCAA eligibility.
	Republic - (Southwest District):	Minimal time spent in building. Would more flexibility appease legislature? This connects to "Why We Play."
	Dexter (Southeast District):	Rewrite homeschool rules - accountability - too lax. Some have transcripts and others don't. Academic accountability - standard. Have control of academics. Kids earned the right to participate.

8. <i>Fall, Winter, and Spring No Contact Periods - Does the membership still feel the need for having them, or should they be modified to no school personnel contact days during that week?</i>	
North Andrew (Northwest District):	There was some discussion on the fall, winter and spring sport 7 day non-contact period prior to each sport season. Discussions occurred in regards to how the current 7 day period for fall can work in collaboration with the summer dead period. Discussion occurred on how camps/clinics/group instruction is restricted but off season condition and non-school competition is not restricted during this 7 day period. Most in attendance did not see a down side to allowing a student to attend a camp/clinic or group instruction on their own accord; however, they still believe that restrictions were needed for school coaches during this 7 day period. In favor of allowing students to participate in camps/clinics/group instruction on their own within 7 days prior to the start of a sport season: 90% in favor.
Mexico (Northeast District):	Background of rule. Majority interested in change.
Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Want more time between seasons, kids need a break. The parents and kids are drinking the kool aid and let them do what they want. Why not allow them to be with their coach? 30 in favor/ 30 opposed/40 no vote.
Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	Is conditioning OK? Why did the rule come in? Need to keep up with the Joneses. Would like to see it loosened up to not have to worry about overseeing outside groups. Why go to a competition and not practice, lesson or instruction with non-school teams? Biggest problem is being able to communicate to the kids what they can or cannot do. 99% in Favor - want deregulation, 1% opposed.
Waynesville (South Central District):	100% in favor of removing.
McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	No school contact, no facility use. Eliminate camp and group lessons. Several schools discussed same thing. 100% in favor.
Republic - (Southwest District):	60% in favor of change to non-school allowance, 30% opposed.
Dexter (Southeast District):	I like the seven day break for coaches. I like the camps. What is the punishment? Would that change the definition of a contact day? What if they play on a non-school team during the no-contact or dead period? 99% in favor of change, 1% opposed.
9. <i>Summer Dead Period - Should the summer dead period be extended from nine days to 14 or 16 days?</i>	
North Andrew (Northwest District):	A lot of discussion occurred in regards to the Summer Dead Period. Nearly all in attendance agree that the summer dead period was a great move and supports keeping the summer dead period. There were comments made about how the philosophy of the dead period and contact days go hand in hand. In other words, it was believed that the initial allowance of summer contact days was to encourage athletes being around school coaches rather than club/travel coaches since students were going to be active during the summer and it would be better to have these athletes involved with school coaches. Most agreed that summer contact days did not restrict the amount contact between our athletes and club/travel coaches because the students are still doing non-school teams the same amount if not more than before summer contact days was permitted. So, the summer time has literally turned into a time during the year that school coaches are using their contact days and students are still going to and participating in travel/club/non-school practices, games, etc. which literally makes a student's summer schedule even more hectic. Many believe that our recent restriction from 25 to 20 summer contact days will help with this issue. Towards the end of the discussion, Superintendent from North Andrew asked about the possibility of requiring 14 days total of summer dead time, allowing schools to set two separate full weeks during the summer as summer dead periods. In favor of staying with current 9 day summer dead period: 25-30%. In favor of increasing to 14 day summer dead period: 25-30%. In favor of increasing to 16 day summer dead period: 25-30%. In favor of 2 separate dead periods, with each being 7 days for a total of 14days: 40%.
Mexico (Northeast District):	14 days or 16 days - 75 Yes - 25 No. 9 days cannot be during the fall no contact period - 50% - 50%. Would this make the student do more things in one day to get 20 days of contact in? if we go to more days drop the contact days to 15 - 10.
Smith-Cotton (Central District):	Not a long enough summer to add additional days. Look at only including one weekend. Rather have 7 and 7 instead of 14 days straight. 99% - keep, 1% - change.
Blue Springs South (Kansas City District):	It is hard to get everything done during the summer, not in favor of expanding. Keeping up with the Joneses. Vast majority opposed to expanding.
Waynesville (South Central District):	Summer camps without overlap and an additional week would make it impossible. I don't think we need to be more restrictive, should be local control. If we have more days of dead period, then we push more kids to AAU programs. Restricting contact pushes more kids to non-school competition and coaches. Start of school year and practice is a concern. 100% leave alone.
McCluer South-Berkeley (St. Louis District):	Don't see the need to add to dead period because of decrease of contact days. The start period for fall season doesn't allow for more days on dead period. 100% leave as is.
Republic - (Southwest District):	With contact days being reduced it is hard to get everything in. In favor of extending - 10% in favor (9 to 14), 5% in favor of (9 to 16), 85% opposed.
Dexter (Southeast District):	We have a minimum, don't need more. We don't need to limit contact with our coaches and kids. Kids need a place where they can feel safe. Kids need to be with families as well. If we increase days, it makes it tough to get everything in. 100% in favor of leaving as it is.

Other comments were made in relation to, if you want the title of being the best you have be able beat the best regardless of whether they are public or private. After several comments on public vs. private as related to whether the multiplier is effective it was noted that schools opinion on this question will be more driven by whether you are a small school vs. big school. How many believe the current multiplier works effectively: 15% agree it is effective at 1.35. Current multiplier does not work effectively: 15-20% believe current multiplier is not effective. Does the multiplier need to be increased: 10% agree on increasing multiplier. Should we consider a sport by sport multiplier: 0% were in favor of a sport by sport multiplier.
	Mexico (Northeast District):	Like - scattering, not majority. want Change - same. No more than half on either. Different sports - no feedback. Tolton and MMA only two nonpublic. MMA understands in same cases - CBC & Tolton, but they are struggling.

Sports Medicine Advisory Committee Meeting Summary

Held December 10, 2014

1. Recommended that the 2013-14 head Injury Report be approved as written.
2. Recommended that the Sports Medicine Committee look into the "Anyone Can Save a Life" program to supplement the local school's emergency action plan
3. Recommended that retired school administrators be allowed to serve as wrestling weight assessors.
4. Recommended that MSHSAA provide information to both the officials and the schools about wrestling injury time outs and procedures that would take place during the blood time out versus the injury time out.

Warning Labels on Football Helmet Required

Each player's football helmet, by rule, must have a visible exterior warning label regarding the risk of injury. The label is part of the National Operating Committee on Standards for Athletic Equipment (NOCSAE) standard and indicates that players have been instructed and understand the risks involved in the game of football. Football helmet manufacturers, helmet reconditioning, sporting goods dealers and individual salesmen, in most cases, will provide free exterior warning labels to the schools.

2016 Annual MSHSAA Election Results

Following are the results of the balloting on the amendments to the MSHSAA Constitution and By-Laws in the 2016 Annual MSHSAA Election. Amendments to By-Laws require a simple majority of those voting for passage, while amendments to the Constitution require a 2/3 majority for passage. Proposals which passed will become effective July 1, 2016, with the exception of Proposal Number 8a and 8b which shall become EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2018.

-PROPOSAL 1 -**(Concussion Insurance Fee) - (FAILED) -****265 FOR, 228 AGAINST (2/3 majority needed for passage)**

Would have amended Article V, Section 1 of the MSHSAA Constitution to require member schools to pay insurance fees for coverage of participants, to include a per student athlete charge for concussion insurance.

- PROPOSAL 2 -**(Petition Wording Requests) - (PASSED) -****412 FOR, 81 AGAINST (2/3 majority needed for passage)**

Amends Article VI, Section 3 of the MSHSAA Constitution by requiring school personnel to request petitions, for wording by the MSHSAA Executive Director, by October 15 annually.

- PROPOSAL 3 -**(Special Transfer Exception - Transfer Between Divorced Parents)****- (PASSED) - 432 FOR, 61 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 3.10.4.e.4 to further define the parameters of this exception for a transfer between divorced parents.

- PROPOSAL 4a -**(Joining the School Team) - (PASSED) -****321 FOR, 135 AGAINST**

Amends By-Laws 3.13.2.a.1 by requiring school sport team members to join/try out for the school team at the start of the school sport season.

- PROPOSAL 4b -**(Joining the School Team) - (PASSED) -****82 FOR, 32 AGAINST**

Amends By-Laws 3.13.2.a.2 by requiring school sport team members to join/try out for the school team at the start of the school sport season.

- PROPOSAL 4c -**(Joining the School Team) - (PASSED) -****337 FOR, 127 AGAINST**

Amends By-Laws 3.13.2.a.3 by requiring school sport team members to join/try out for the school team at the start of the school sport season.

- PROPOSAL 5 -**(No Contact Periods - Fall, Winter, Spring) - (PASSED) -****373 FOR, 120 AGAINST**

Amends By-Laws 3.13, 3.14 and 3.15 by deregulating the seasonal No-Contact Periods to allow student participation in non-school camps/clinics/group sport lessons during those seven days. Contact with school coaches and open facilities will continue to be restricted during the seven days prior to the first allowable practice date.

- PROPOSAL 6 -**(Individuals Playing in Two Basketball Tournaments in the Same Week) - (PASSED) -****362 FOR, 129 AGAINST**

Amends By-Law 3.21.3 by allowing individuals (not teams) to play in two separate basketball tournaments during the same calendar week without limitation as to timing or school being out of session. (This does NOT allow a player that plays on multiple levels to play for the JV and the Varsity team if both are participating in the same basketball tournament.)

- PROPOSAL 7 -**(Cash Awards to Schools in Activities) - (PASSED) -****282 FOR, 207 AGAINST**

Amends By-law 4.1.8, 4.2.4, 4.3.4, and 4.4.4 to allow schools to accept cash prizes among other awards, for placement or participation in contests.

- PROPOSAL 8a -**(Annual Enrollment Collection and Classification Determination)****- (PASSED) -****173 FOR, 135 AGAINST**

Amends the By-Law 5.1.7 to allow football classification breaks to be made annually based on yearly enrollment data (rather than every other year.) (Beginning with the 2018-19 school year.)

- PROPOSAL 8b -**(Annual Enrollment Collection and Classification Determination)****- (PASSED) -****279 FOR, 179 AGAINST**

Amends the By-Law 1.4.1, Cooperative Sponsorships, to require senior high school cooperative agreements to be formed annually. (Beginning with the 2018-19 school year.)

All other six-dive meet qualifying standard requirements remain unchanged.

Eleven-Dive Meet Qualifying Standards:

Boys: 356 points (no change) and added a 20.5 total degree of difficulty minimum.

Girls: 385 points and added a 20.5 total degree of difficulty minimum. All other eleven-dive meet qualifying standard requirements remain unchanged.

- 3) Recommended that team managers be further restricted at the state meet, specifically that each team be allowed

to bring a maximum of one and that a manager must be a high school student.

- 4) Recommended that diving practice flights on Friday be filled on a first-come, first-served basis if a procedure for doing so can be developed for little to no cost.

- *6) Recommended that an item be placed on the 2017 Annual Ballot, to restrict the number of high school meets missed by an athlete as a result of participating in a club meet, to a maximum of two.

Basketball Advisory Committee Summary

Held April 15, 2016

- ** 1. Recommend allowing an individual athlete season quarter limitations of six times the number of regular season contests.

Rationale: Illinois has recently eliminated the season quarter limit for basketball and went to a quarter limit per day (six). This concept is much easier to track and would be much easier for teams to be in compliance. Currently a player can play six in a day but only gets five times the number of regular season games.

- * 2. Recommend that Missouri submit a rule proposal to the NFHS for the implementation of a 35-second shot clock for state adoption.

Rationale: Other states use a shot clock currently, obviously all levels of basketball outside of high school use it (including AAU) and football has a play clock as well.

3. Recommend to revise the seed meeting procedure in the Basketball Manual (Section 3: District Entry Procedure, E. Seed Meeting, item 1.) as follows:

"The mandatory seeding procedure is to seed each spot individually starting with the #1 seed, followed by the #2 seed, continuing to the last seed. Schools may not vote for themselves in the seeding

process. The district schools participating in the meeting shall take into account each team's win-loss record (varsity vs. varsity games only), head to head competition, caliber of competition, and common opponents they have played over the season. If a tie should occur, a second vote would be used to determine the seed but only the district schools who are not involved with the tie would participate in the second vote. If a tie remains, it shall be broken based on head to head competition of the tied teams. Should a tie still exist, a coin flip shall determine the seeds of the tied teams. This specific procedure shall be followed by district manager."

4. Recommend to revise the seed meeting procedure in the Basketball Manual (Section 3: District Entry Procedure, E. Seed Meeting, item 1.) as follows:

"The mandatory seeding procedure is to seed each spot individually starting with the #1 seed, followed by the #2 seed, continuing to the last seed. The district schools participating in the meeting shall take into account each team's win-loss record (varsity vs. varsity games only), head to head competition, caliber of competition, and common opponents they have played over the season. After the

tournament director receives each school vote after each round, the tournament director must make each vote known to all participating coaches in the room. If a tie should occur, a second vote would be used to determine the seed but only the district schools who are not involved with the tie would participate in the second vote. If a tie remains, it shall be broken based on head to head competition of the tied teams. Should a tie still exist, a coin flip shall determine the seeds of the tied teams. This specific procedure shall be followed by district manager."

- * 5. Recommend adding two additional games to the regular season. *Rationale: Kids get tired of practicing. Some weeks where there are just 1 or no games. Garner clarified the recommendation is for 22 games/1 tournament; 20 games/2 tournaments; and 18 games/3 tournament schedules.*

To submit new literature for consideration to be placed on the MSHSAA PGML please follow the steps below. Please review the matrixes for each area of the list prior to submitting literature. Each matrix is located on the MSHSAA website under the Music Activities link.

Print and complete the specific 'Literature Addition Request Form' for each title you are submitting for consideration. Each form is located on the MSHSAA website. The forms have been specifically designed for each area of the list. Please be sure to select the appropriate request form for your selection(s).

Attach a photocopy (Do not send ORIGINALS) of the score with the 'Literature Addition Request Form' and mail to the MSHSAA Office on or before June 1st. For solos, include a copy of the soloist part with each measure numbered. For ensembles, all parts shall appear on the score and each measure should be numbered. Do NOT send originals! All photocopies will be destroyed after the review.

A completed 'Literature Addition Request Form' must accompany each title being submitted for review. Any music submitted without a completed 'Literature Addition Request Form' will not be reviewed and the music will be returned to the sender.

The individual school directors play a major role in the development and maintenance of the list. Please do not submit literature just because the music is in your library rather; submit quality literature that is not currently listed. Please consider sharing this information with studio or private music instructors as well. Be certain to submit your music before June 1st. Music received after June 1st will not be reviewed for consideration for the 2017 music festivals.

A \$25.00 late penalty fee will be assessed to each school music director that fails to submit the required adjudicator evaluation(s) by the established deadlines.

The adjudicator evaluations are intended to provide practical feedback to the adjudicator on his/her strengths as well as identifying areas to improve. This process also assists the district festival manager and MSHSAA office when securing adjudicators for future festivals. Keep in mind that you are providing useful feedback as to how the judge performed/executed his/her responsibilities as a MSHSAA adjudicator. Comments should be constructive in nature and not personal attacks on the individual; just as you would expect to see on your soloist and ensemble evaluation form(s).
